



If you are coming to the 2010 ARMA Canada Conference.....

The following events and activities have been planned just for you to enjoy during your stay in London, Ontario so “mark your calendars” now and plan to join in on the fun! **All events will be available for sign-up at the Registration Desk on a first-come, first-served basis, with the exception of events #6 and #7 – this is an individual choice and ticket purchase.**

1. Monday evening (May 31st) – Labatt Brewery Tour (5 – 7 p.m.)

London is the hometown of Labatt Breweries of Canada. Labatt’s London plant produces nearly 40 percent of the beer brewed in Canada. The Labatt story began more than 160 years ago in London, in what was then known as Canada West. At that time, John Labatt’s small brewery produced the equivalent of about 1,000 bottles of beer a year. Following a \$50 million expansion in 2000 and an additional \$40 million in 2005/06, the London Facility production capacity has increased to 4 million hectoliters, the equivalent of one billion bottles of beer a year. With a portfolio of 60 quality beers and breweries from coast to coast, Labatt employs 3,000 Canadians across five major markets: Western, Prairies, Ontario, Quebec, and Atlantic.

The tour takes about 2 hours and consists of a 45-minute full guided tour of the brewery (brewing, fermenting, ageing and packaging). There will be a taste sampling session after the tour that includes Bud Light, Budweiser, Labatt Blue, Stella Artois and Keith’s IPA. Everyone also receives a souvenir tour T-shirt and a 15% discount coupon on merchandise for the Labatt Retail Store (located right next door to the Brewery).

Once the tour is done, the group will proceed to a room where the Streamliner and Keg Truck are on display.

Note: **The tour costs \$10/person** and everyone on the tour **MUST** wear closed toe, closed heel and flat footwear (running shoes preferred). Bus transportation will be provided from the conference hotel to the Brewery. There is a limit of 60 people for the tour on a first come, first served basis. Pick-up time at the Delta London Armouries will be **4:45 p.m.**

Following the tour, the bus will transport participants downtown for dinner together at a local restaurant.

(2:00 – 3:15 p.m.)

If you have a late flight home or might be interested in the Archives and Research Collection Centre located at The University of Western Ontario, please join us on the Tour following the closing ceremonies of the Conference.

Note: There will be a charge of \$10/person for transportation for this event. Maximum number of participants is 25. Sign up at the Registration Desk **on a first-come, first served** basis.

Tour Information

The Archives and Research Collections Centre (ARCC) located at The University of Western Ontario was originally envisioned in the early 1990s as a book depository. By the time construction was approved in 2001, however, its functions were expanded to include archives and records centre services.

Officially opened in April 2004, the ARCC is the home of The University of Western Ontario Archives (Western Archives). It provides a secure, controlled environment to preserve important archives and special collections and to provide storage and retrieval services for low and medium use library materials transferred from Western's six campus libraries and for semi-active university records in order to address the administrative needs of the University. It has a total capacity of the equivalent of 1.6 million library volumes or approximately 80,000 records storage boxes.

The ARCC tour will highlight the following areas:

- The John A. Schweitzer Gallery: exhibit space for displaying Archives' holdings
- Reading Room: public area where requested items are consulted
- Administration Area: staff office space and shipping and receiving
- Processing Area: staff work space used to arrange and describe archival materials, process transfers and retrievals of records or library materials, and provide electronic document delivery service
- Compact Shelving Area: secure storage for rare books and other special collections
- High Density Module: 9300 square feet of 30' high storage space used to store semi-active records, archives, and low and medium use library materials

During the tour information will be provided about the process of planning the ARCC and how construction and occupancy unfolded, as well as about the challenges associated with designing and operating a multi-functional facility in an academic environment.

Bus Information

The bus will depart from the Delta London Armouries at **1:45 p.m.** It will then drop off and pick up visitors in front of Alumni Hall, which is near the Lambton Road Welcome Centre, just off Western Road.

Tour participants should cross the traffic circle, proceed northeast along Oxford Road, and then turn left toward the main entrance of The D. B. Weldon Library across from the University Community Centre. Public access to the ARCC is via the main floor of the Weldon Library. Once inside there will be signs directing tour participants to the ARCC.

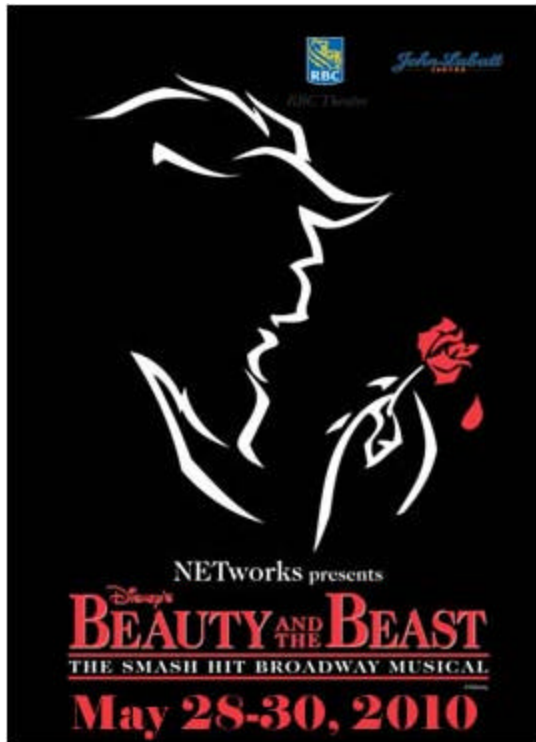

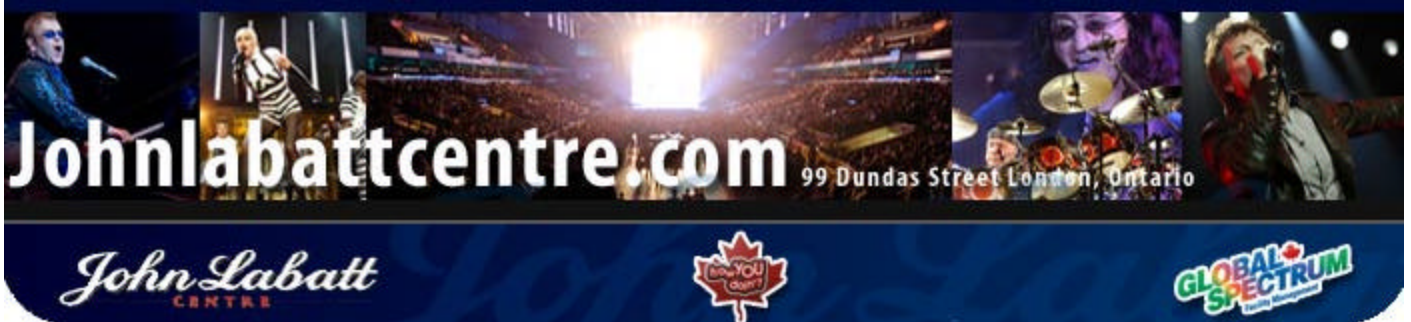

7. HOT-AIR BALLOON RIDES (Sundance Balloons)

Floating high above the sky, passengers inside the basket of a hot-air balloon are introduced to a splendid view of London and the surrounding countryside. Sundance Balloons is Canada's largest and favourite hot air balloon company. The main flying season is **May through October**. Flights are scheduled seven days a week, twice daily, roughly half an hour before sunrise and two and half hours before sunset. Flights must be booked in advance and may be cancelled because of poor weather conditions.
